Know Before You Go.

<u>Will Social Distancing be required?</u>: Yes. Bathrooms and concession stands will have 6-foot markers and signage. Sections of the bleachers or entire sets may be temporarily closed.

<u>Will face coverings be required</u>? Yes. Per Pima County Resolution.

<u>Does everyone have to wear a face covering</u>? Some people are exempt; Children under 5, individuals with certain medical conditions, the hearing impaired or those translating for the hearing impaired. Other individuals and circumstances are exempt. See the list of exemptions on the Pima County Resolution.

<u>I am a competitor.</u> Do I still have to wear a face covering: Yes. The only time you may remove your face covering is while mounted on a horse readying to compete, while competing, when exiting the arena.

When is ok to remove my face covering? When you are with members of your own household or party, of 10 people or less and are 6 feet away from others who are not members of your own household or party. When you are eating or drinking. Other exemptions apply and can be read from the Pima County Resolution.

What else do I need to know?

<u>COVID-19 Warning and Assumption of Risk</u>: The Pima County Fairgrounds is working with Pima County to take proper precautions to keep our staff and guests as safe as possible while visiting the Pima County Fairgrounds and RV Park.
